Executive Summary

Times have never been tougher for families of children and young people with SEND

With no end in sight to the austerity that has depleted public services, created endless waiting lists and all but left families to their own devices, parent-carers are being forced to find alternative solutions to the struggles they face.

Reaching Families exists to help parents find those solutions. Our mission of empowering parentcarers has never been more needed. For almost all the families we support, self-reliance is the only option they have left.

Our information, training and peer support helps parents become experts through experience. Whether it's fighting for their child at tribunals, home educating children who are unable to attend school or learning how best to support their mental health, wellbeing and development, parents are pulling together and doing this for themselves – and for each other.

Our training provision best illustrates this new reality. In the year before the covid pandemic Reaching Families delivered 33 workshops to 426 parents-carers. In 2023/24 we delivered 84 workshops and courses to 1,305 parents. Such is the demand for knowledge and skills, if time and funding allowed, we could easily double our provision.

We have always known that families of children with SEND face multiple challenges, hence our long-term plan to create a one stop shop of services that enables parent-carers to access support across many issues under one roof. Parents are used to being passed from pillar to post. Our job is to minimise that experience. **Geaching Families** have been incredible. Information

In an era of scarcity knowledge is power

Navigating the labyrinth of information needed to support a child with SEND has never been easy for parent-carers but never been more important than in this era of scarce support.

A survey of parent-carers we carried out in early 2024 shows that our parentcarer guide, Making Sense of It All remains essential reading for parentcarers in West Sussex whilst our newly updated factsheet series continue to be downloaded from our website in the thousands.

We also published a new animation for younger children to help them understand the assessment process for Autism. In 2024/25 we will be publishing a companion animation for older children. 66The book was a godsend, laid out so clearly, helping me to understand what support was out there and what I could chase down. We're a year on now, and with the transition to college, I've found myself dipping into the book again to understand how to navigate this next chapter. Training

Waiting times for local services leads to huge demand for training

Where we once used to talk of our workshops selling out in a matter of days, we now talk in minutes – three minutes being the record for one of our newer workshops we delivered this year on Autism in Girls.

Whilst it is heartening to know our workshops are so relevant to the needs of SEND families we take no satisfaction at all that in 2023 the waiting lists to attend our training workshops were almost twice as high as those who attended. A major priority in 2024 will be securing funding to increase the capacity of our training delivery and ensure we can optimise the number of parents who can access our workshops and courses.

Benefits Advice Service

The cost of living crisis increases demand for our benefits advice service

With the cost of living crisis continuing to bite deep and more families being forced to seek private provision for their child, demand for our Benefits Advice Service showed no sign of abating in 2023. There was particular demand from vulnerable families who need additional support in making claims and/or appeals to tribunals.

We ended the year with confirmation of almost £90,000 over three years from the National Lottery Community Fund to continue the development of the service. This much needed funding will allow us to make permanent the post of Benefits Support Worker who helps parents in checking claims and create a new post of team administrator. Above all it helps ensure the longer-term sustainability of the service. **66**This award will make a huge difference to our child and I just wanted to say thank you for your help and advice. If it wasn't for organisations like Reaching Families we wouldn't have even known about DLA. I had always assumed that as both me and my husband are employed, we wouldn't be eligible for any financial support. **?**

Face-2-Face Befriending

Supporting more new parent-carers than ever

There is no support for a new parent-carer quite like the empathy and wisdom of another parent who's lived through the same experience.

Our parent-carer befrienders provide an invaluable source of support to parents of children waiting on, undergoing or recently assessed for SEND – helping with information, signposting, empathy and sharing their own personal experiences. Demand for the service has risen every year since we started the project in 2018 and now, with the largest team of befrienders we have ever had (30 in total), supporting more new parent-carers than ever. We are immensely grateful to our befrienders for their simply invaluable support.

Umbrellas

New groups help more parents develop their own networks of support

We've long known the best support parent-carers receive is from other parents with a similar life experience. That is why expanding the reach of our Umbrellas support groups has been so vital to helping parents develop their own networks of support.

With the development of four new Umbrellas support groups in Burgess Hill, Chichester, Horsham and Shoreham-by-Sea our community outreach now covers almost all the major urban areas of West Sussex (including Littlehampton and Worthing) and surrounding areas.

In this post covid era of remote delivery our groups are a vital means of parents accessing in person peer support, seeking information and signposting from our outreach team and generally being around other people who understand the challenges they face. It's made my life so much better having this amazing support network ??

NDP Navigation Service

Supporting parent-carers waiting for their child to be assessed for ADHD, Autism and other neurodiverse conditions

Waiting on assessment for ADHD, Autism and other neurodiverse conditions can be interminably long for children and families in need of support. We were therefore thrilled to be asked by NHS Sussex to pilot a new navigation service for parents of children and young people at various points on the West Sussex Neurodevelopmental Pathway.

Launched in January 2024 our new service provides initial telephone support, information, advice, signposting and training to parent-carers. By the end of the financial year (March 2024) it was clear this could be our most in demand service to date.
